**Public Prosecution Service figures**

The Public Prosecution Service has figures that give an indication of the nature and number of reports of domestic violence, and the number of convictions. These data are available on request.

**Domestic Violence Support Centre figures**

In 2012 a total of 10,399 women used women’s shelters. In 2013 the domestic violence support centres received 30,440 applications for assistance, and the Advice and Reporting Centre for Child Abuse and Neglect was contacted on 66,716 occasions.

**Figures for the Caribbean Netherlands**

Records of domestic violence are incomplete. For an indication of the scale of the problem, see the following passage from a study entitled ‘Tackling domestic violence on Bonaire, St Eustatius and Saba (*De aanpak van huiselijk geweld op de BES-eilanden*)’, which was commissioned by the Ministry of Security and Justice, the Ministry of Health, Welfare and Sport and the Ministry of Education, Culture and Science, and performed by Regioplan Policy Research.

There is a taboo on domestic violence. People are ashamed and reluctant to admit it because of the stigma attached and financial dependence on the perpetrator. All respondents therefore believe that domestic violence (in all its forms) occurs much more often than reports would suggest, and that it is a large-scale and urgent problem. The extent to which the different records overlap is unclear. No central records are kept, so no overall figures are available.

<b>Article 23</b>	<p>1. It is the concern of the authorities to secure the means of subsistence of the population, achieve the distribution of wealth and promote well-being.</p> <p>2. Rules concerning entitlement to social security are laid down by country ordinance.</p> <p>3. Residents having Dutch nationality who are unable to provide for themselves have a right, regulated by country ordinance, to public assistance.</p>
<b>Article 25</b>	<p>1. The authorities must take steps to promote the health of the population.</p> <p>2. It is the concern of the authorities to provide sufficient living accommodation.</p> <p>3. The authorities must promote social and cultural development and leisure activities.</p>
<b>Article 27</b>	It is the concern of the authorities to protect young people and promote their right to education and cultural education and to engage in sport and leisure activities.
